## **UKZN Religion Professor Tours USA Colleges**

Prof.Simangaliso Kumalo of the UKZN School of Religion, Philosophy and Classics (SRPC) recently did an academic lecture tour of Universities in the United States. At the Frederick Douglas Centre for African-American studies at the University of Rochester, New York, he delivered a lecture titled "Religion and Governance: A Necessity or Public Nuisance? An African Perspective." At the Department of Religion at Drake University, Des Moines, Iowa, where Prof Kumalo had established a UKZN connection 10 years ago, he participated in their international partnership week and discussed further collaborations between UKZN and Drake.

While in the US, Prof Kumalo was among 10,000 religion scholars and students from around the world attending the American Academy of Religion's annual conference in Denver, Colorado. He chaired a session titled "Ecology and Creation in Wesleyan and Methodist Perspective." It was an opportunity, Prof. Kumalo said, "to contribute to global scholarship and place UKZN on the map."

IRESH PILLAY, CA (SA)

Iresh Pillay, 38, is the innovative founding partner of a recruiting agency in New York City, that places accountants and financial professionals at industry-leading and large, reputable companies across the USA.

Iresh grew up in Queensburgh, outside Durban, and graduated at the Durban campus with an honors degree in accounting in 2002. He was a recipient of financial aid from UKZN as well as a bursary from the Will Howley Fund which made his tertiary education possible. "For that," he says, "I will forever be indebted to the university."

After completing his studies at UKZN, Iresh relocated to Johannesburg to start work at Grant Thornton, one of the largest accounting firms in the world, where he completed his articles and qualified as a CA (SA). He worked there until 2007 when he fulfilled his career ambition by moving to New York City, and getting a job with another top international accounting firm, BDO.

Over the next few years Iresh, as an accountant, gained exposure to the world of financial services including clients in hedge funds, private equity, asset managers, insurance, banking and others.

As much as he enjoyed his time in the industry, Iresh's outgoing personality, coupled with his love for working with people, made recruiting a better fit for his talents. He then started at Nevis Recruiting in December

2012, excelling in the profession – he made partner after his 3rd year of service. During his time at the firm, Iresh placed candidates at levels from associate up to CFO in a range of industries.

After five successful years at Nevis, Iresh decided to start his own recruitment firm, adopting a more innovative, creative approach to talent acquisition in the world of accounting and finance. He founded Eclipse Recruiting Solutions- inspired by the concept of the perfect alignment of the sun, moon and earth, "just as we envisage to perfectly align the candidate with the right job at the right client".
