Profile of Guest Speaker and UKZN Alumnus

Professor Penelope Andrews

Professor Andrews [(B.A. LL.B. (UKZN) LL.M. (Columbia)], Dean and Professor at UCT Faculty of Law, is a noted human rights scholar and advocate. She began her legal career at the Legal Resources Centre in Johannesburg, South Africa's premier public interest law firm.

Prior to becoming the Dean at UCT, Dean Andrews served as President and Dean at Albany Law School in New York, the first female President and Dean for the school which was founded in 1851. She was previously the Associate Dean for Academic Affairs at the City University of New York School of Law (CUNY). Prior to joining CUNY, she was a Professor and Director of international studies at Valparaiso Law School.

She began her teaching career at La Trobe University in Melbourne, Australia and since then has been tenured at five law schools in Australia and the USA. She has served on significant law school committees and the boards of public interest and human rights organizations, including the Africa Section of Human Rights Watch, the Legal Resources Center and the National Center for Law and Economic Justice.

Dean Andrews has received many awards for her work. In 2015 she received the National Bar Association's International Award for her global human rights advocacy. In recognition of her human rights work, the University of KwaZulu-Natal provides an annual award in her name.

She has published 4 books and over 50 articles that focus on comparative constitutional law, gender and racial equality, human rights, legal education and the judiciary. She also publishes regularly in the popular and social media, focusing on issues of race, poverty, legal education and contemporary South African issues.
