Guest Speaker Professor Nana Poku

Professor Nana Poku is the Deputy Vice-Chancellor and Head of the College of Law and Management Studies.

Before assuming this position, he previously served as the Executive Director of the Health Economics and HIV AIDS Research Centre (HEARD).

Professor Poku is a Political Economist with a research focus on health provision in Africa. Over the past two decades, his research on the political economy of Africa's HIV and AIDS epidemic has been amongst the most influential on the subject. Within the context of the World Health Organisation's global aim to treat three million persons living with HIV and AIDS by 2005, he directed operational research for the World Bank funded Treatment Acceleration Programme (TAP) to test the feasibility of complex medication scale-up in resource-limited settings.

Professor Poku has a wide array of published work on globalisation and security; HIV/AIDS epidemic in Africa; global health; governance; migration and human security. He has published 16 books, over 50 book contributions and more than 30 peer-reviewed articles in internationally recognised journals.

Professor Poku was formerly Pro-Vice Chancellor of Research at the University of Bradford where he also served as Dean of School of Social and International Studies. Prior to Bradford, he held senior faculty posts at Universities of Southampton and Nottingham Trent, UK.
