Professor Dan Remenyi, after some 20 years in business joined academe 30 years ago. His main academic interest is in research methodology and the sociology of research. He has held visiting professorships at 10 different Universities b etween t he UK, I reland, South Africa and Sweden. He has more than 60 peer reviewed academic papers published in journal and some 30 books. He is an alumnus of University of Natal. He hold a BSocSc, MBA and PhD.



Dr David Sarpong, reader in Strategic Management, and Head of the Brunel University Strategy, Entrepreneurship, and International Business (SEIB) Research Group. His research interest lies in the broad areas of strategic management and international management, and his current research concerns second-order innovation and technology management, strategic foresight. A co-Convenor of the Annual Doctoral Symposium of the British Academy of Management (BAM), he serves on the BAM Council Sub-Committee of Academic Affairs of Conference and Capacity Building.



Professor Rose Boohene, is an Associate Professor of Enterprise Development at the Centre for Entrepreneurship and Small Enterprise Development, University of Cape Coast. She was the former Head of Department of Management Studies, Vice Dean of the School of Business, Dean for International Education at the University of Cape Coast, and Visiting Professor at the Bonn-Rhein-Sieg University of Applied Sciences, Germany.



Professor Vannie Naidoo, a full time academic and researcher at the University of KwaZulu-Natal, in the College of Law & Management studies. Her field of teaching is in management, corporate strategy, project management, entrepreneurship, research methodology and marketing. She has supervised and graduated over 30 PHD and Masters students' to date. She sits on local and international Conference Boards, Editorial Boards and has published various journal articles and book chapters in both interdisciplinary and transdisciplinary research. Prof. Naidoo has been Keynote speaker at two international conferences and a resource speaker for the AAU, East Africa.
